Lieutenant Governor Lawton Receives National Arts Leadership Award from Americans for the Arts

On July 23 Wisconsin Lieutenant Governor Barbara Lawton received the 2008 Lieutenant Governors Arts Leadership Award. This honor is presented by Americans for the Arts (AFTA) and the National Lieutenant Governors Association (NLGA). The award honors a public official who has demonstrated outstanding leadership in the advancement of the arts at the state level.

Lt. Governor Lawton, who was nominated for the Arts Leadership Award by Arts Wisconsin and the Wisconsin Arts Board, has been a tireless and passionate advocate for the arts and arts education across Wisconsin. As chair of the Wisconsin Arts Board (WAB), Lawton engages both public and private sectors in a shared agenda to establish Wisconsin's stronghold in the creative economy. She promotes the arts and culture industry as a powerful sector in itself and as an animating force for economic, educational and civic growth and vitality in communities across the state.

In receiving the Arts Leadership Award, Lt. Governor Lawton was specifically recognized for her leadership:

- to realign WAB programs and services with the Board's expanded role in economic development;
- to establish a public campaign to support that work
- to pass tax incentives for WI's film, television, and video game industries
- to create the Wisconsin Task Force on Arts and Creativity in Education in partnership with State Superintendent of Public Instruction Elizabeth Burmaster
- to initiate the partnership between the NLGA and Americans for the Arts.

PRESIDENT'S PAGE

IT'S FALL AGAIN – my favorite time of year – and life is falling back into a more familiar rhythm as compared to the “let’s make the most of every moment of this short summer” mindset that seems to rule our warmest

days. Along with berry picking and a few days at the beach, I took my kids to one of the many concerts at the Lake Superior Big Top Chautauqua (Gaelic Storm was fabulous!) and also to the Art Institute while we were in Chicago. Although they were not nearly as awed as I was with seeing the works of Seurat, Monet, Van Gogh, and Picasso, I hope they appreciated the experience. I remember my parents dragging me around to museums, making sure I practiced for my music lessons, and pointing out the beauty of sculptures in the city. At the time I didn’t necessarily appreciate their efforts, but it didn’t take me long to realize that my appreciation of music, architecture, and art were all fostered by my parents exposing me to these things from the very beginning.

Now that the kids have gone back to school, I spend a lot of time thinking about their education, and I believe arts education is an important part of the overall education package. The state of Wisconsin has arts education on their radar screen. Lieutenant Governor Barbara Lawton and State Superintendent Elizabeth Burmaster are co-chairs of the new Wisconsin Task Force on Arts and Creativity in Education. This task force will examine state-level policies and local practices to determine their impact on the scope and access to quality arts education opportunities in Wisconsin; recommend refinement and changes, as well as new initiatives, to support arts education, creativity, and innovation; and identify state and local

agencies, organizations, and businesses that can collaborate to provide leadership and resources in support of arts education, creativity, and innovation.

Many Wisconsin school districts face challenges providing arts education in their curriculums. Last academic year, twenty-nine Milwaukee public elementary and middle schools had no visual art teacher. Other districts closer to home provide visual art classes to their students on impossibly small budgets of a only a few dollars per student per year. At that level of funding, you are asking a teacher to make “stone soup” – something wonderful out of almost nothing.

There are no easy answers to these challenges, that are riddled with complexities on all levels of school funding and politics. But Wisconsin is fortunate to have a Lieutenant Governor, who chairs the Wisconsin Arts Board and advocates for education, and a State Superintendent, who directs education efforts and advocates for the arts. They are truly “The Dynamic Duo.” They are working to ensure that Wisconsin develops its creative workforce and gives rise to the entrepreneurial talent needed to compete in a 21st century global economy.

So, as the Dynamic Duo does what they can to better the education of our young people, let’s remember that education happens of many levels. Parents and other adults providing opportunities, local artists inspiring students by sharing their love for their art form, and teachers passionately working to develop their students’ potential will all leave an indelible mark on young people as they grow into the future leaders, creators, and entrepreneurs of the coming years.

Enjoy the arts!
